your content (lesson materials & resources)

rethink things (somewhat)



you can't translate your lessons exactly [let that go]



be open, adaptable, flexible



consider challenges students are facing at home



dial it waaaaay back





use tech you have already been using

avoid stress: not too many new things

focus on the MUSIC & learning outcomes

IF you're still at school



what to do NOW



survey families: tech



you: learn the essential tech tools NOW



students: practice using tech tools; set up systems



prepare printed packets of materials



send home books, devices, instruments



delivery: lesson look & feel



asynchronous vs synchronous



best: mostly asynchronous

issues with synchronous learning: access, devices, adults present







for most lessons you will...

prepare handouts or digital resources

upload materials & share with students

video conference (sometimes) : live

the tech: essentials



tech essentials: 3 main things



learning management system: your learning "home"



video conferencing tool: for live sessions

screencasting software: to make teaching videos





avoid stress: not too many new things

use tech you have ALREADY been using

learning management system (Ims)

one place to gather teaching materials

common: Google Classroom, Microsoft Teams, SeeSaw



others: Moodle, Blackboard, Canvas, website/blog



I don't have one - now what?





- it's like Skype or FaceTime (larger-scale)
- best: Zoom, Hangouts/Meet, Teams
- don't try to teach EVERYTHING this way!

ways of using



live lecture-style delivery or two-way



mute/unmute students



chat window feature



best for: check-ins, questions, connections (students & teacher), SOME live teaching

record your screen and/or your face

best options: Screencastify or Loom

other options: Quicktime, Screenflow, Camtasia

use laptop - better workflow

encastify or Loom

tips



plan your video first



don't worry about mistakes!



show your face to connect with students (afraid/nervous? Get over it!)



can record tab audio (turn on in settings)



useful for feedback & assessment





other essential tech tools



presentation software (PPT, Keynote, Slides)

it's free



useful for ALL



playing assessments, singing, speaking, share thoughts, journal, feedback, perform rhythms, storytelling with SFX, show what you know
